In the New Testament the Apostle John talks about Jesus saying,  
**“So, if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.”** (John 8:36 NIV)

### **Two questions: Who is the Son and what is it to be free?**

#### **The Son**

Earlier in John the Apostle’s account about Jesus, he tells us:

“No one has ever seen God, but the one and only Son, who is himself God and is in the closest relationship with the Father, has made him known.” (Jn.1:18 NIV)

We discover that Jesus is how God reveals himself to humanity in human form. And when I say human form, I do not mean he only looks like a human as a spiritual image but is fully human, flesh and bone.

This is a bold claim, but one people could understand, especially those of Jewish heritage, because God had placed his Spirit in many people over the years to act as his voice: the patriarch Abraham, Moses, the various Judges, prophets, priests and kings.

John’s claim may have been interpreted as saying Jesus is a very special person of God.

**However, John goes further to say that Jesus is himself God. This claim is the boldest...** Jesus was not human first and later blessed and anointed by God, but Jesus is himself God who came to us as human.

Scriptures and Jesus’ direct voice tell us that he is to be known by us as the **Son of God** and, in doing so, we gain a much more personal connection with God. This is both because God in human form is Jesus, Son of God, but also because that title reveals that God is also our Father – and a good one, the only truly good Father that has or will ever be.

#### **To be Free**

It is in the Son’s power to reconnect us with the mighty creator God, who is our Father for it is He who created us, and when that bond is made, the one tying us to the brokenness of this world is itself broken.

**We are freed from the curse of death, freed the curse of repeated generational mistakes and patterns of living as a broken people!**

So, if the son sets you free, you will be free indeed!
